

## GEOMETRIC GLOBES

### 1) Objectives:

- encouraging collaboration between subjects – using the arts to integrate subject-areas;
- to spend time thinking and recording ideas, thoughts, impressions that are important to express;
- to express the importance of peace in the world and to foster understanding between the peoples of the world;
- to create a personalized gift for someone else that will remind them of peace.

### 2) Goal:

- to create a personalized geometric globe that represents you in a peaceful world.

### 3) Materials:

- 12 cutout shapes from template for each person (see attachment)
- cover stock or typing paper;
- scissors, glue sticks, pencils, markers, glitter, colored pencils, etc.

### 4) Instructions:

- **step one** → each person is to try and create images, ideas, beliefs, recipes, poems, thoughts, descriptions, etc. on the twelve surfaces available to them;
- **step two** → once these are complete each person is to cut out the pentagon shapes and place his/her name, country/region, email address on the back of the shapes;
- **step three** → all of these shapes can be assembled as one geometric globe by folding along the dotted lines and gluing the edges if they are to remain as a permanent unit for the entire time.

! NOTE 1 → a variation would be to mix everyone's shapes together in the room and have each person pick out twelve shapes from the other people in the activity and then put them together with the glue.

! NOTE 2 → another variation would be to clip the personal globes together for the workshop and then take them apart at the end of the week using the above mix-up method. This version will allow everyone to see the personal geometric globes on exhibit for the time of the workshop and then reassembled in a symbolic gesture of sharing part of their with each other. These pieces could then be taken back to each region of Armenia and reassembled at home.
