

Funding of iEARN

(The funding depends on the country as well as the maturity of the iEARN programme)

- a. Membership fees (where there is an infrastructure that allows this but many countries/schools/teachers are too poor)
- b. Government Sponsorship/grants: Often for Youth activities (NB many iEARN programmes are considered extracurricular seek to be recognized as contributing to the national curriculum objective within their country.)
- c. International contracts: Often these contracts will be with telecommunications companies with international programmes (such as Intel teachers for the future, Adobe Youth Voices programme or UNESCO ASPnet programme) or via International programmes sponsored by Ministry's of Education (ex. Dutch government, British Council, Dutch Ministry of Education).
- d. Local fundraising
- e. Partnerships to exchange services/support: telecommunications companies may provide internet support while computer exchange programmes may provide software and use iEARN teacher trainers to deliver their training programmes
- f. Other: Personal donations to support some teacher workshops and youth activities.
